Why Does Causevest Need Operators?



Operators form an important part of our community and add an additional layer of integrity that helps protect the Causevest network in short they are pretty awesome.

Rewarding Operators enables us to encourage new adopters into the cryptocurrency space, who might not have the ability to become miners or run nodes in other networks due to the technical barriers to entry.

Who can be an Operator?

Anyone can be an Operator as long as they have the ability to "vote" with XCV coins. The easiest way to vote is by owning XCV, but you can have coins nominated and distributed to you if you are proven to be someone who can act on the coin holder's behalf


Types of Operators

- **Supporter:** someone who supports (or helps) to promote a particular cause or category of causes on the network.
- Maintainer: someone who focuses primarily on validating the data causes upload, enabling them to generate additional capital, mitigate contracts and organize causes into cause categories that are listed on the network (similar to Wikipedia pages).

What is an Operator?

Operators are the workers of Causevest ecosystem they earn income that can be recycled into good causes on the network as they use goods and services that are offered in our cryptocurrency (XCV).

Anyone who makes a signal to the network that is eligible for a proof of cause reward can be considered an Operator.



How do Operators Work?

After generating a certain amount of revenue, every Operator must hold deposit that is linked to the network.

This a minimum amount necessary for this deposit will be specified, and the deposit enables the Operator to generate any additional capital over the minimum deposit amount.

The minimum deposit amount also holds Operators to a code of integrity, and can act as collateral if Operators do anything to become a "bad actor" or threaten the network's integrity.

Operators can work for Causevest in one of two ways:

- Internally (on the network)
- Externally (off the network)

How are Operators rewarded?

Operators are rewarded in two ways:

- 1. They receive a fixed share of profit-generating fees from any cause linked to them on the basis of their previous work and collaboration.
- 2. They have the ability to generate new coins for the work they do in the network that is recognized by either the Proof of Cause (POC) Protocol or the open-source platform operator.

Protocol and Platform Rewards: Increase Your Artifical Mining Power!

When a Supporter or Maintainer Operator completes a task that is recognized by the Causevest worker node, they generate proofs, which increase the probability of generating new XCV coins. Proofs are essentially the same as mining power; the more work you do in the network, the more proofs you generate. The higher the amount of proofs that you have, the higher the probability will be that you generate an XCV coin. The more you have "proven" to do good work, the higher rank that your Causevest wallet will receive. A higher rank enables you generate a higher rate of proofs for the additional work that you do within the network. This encourages good acting, while further punishing and discriminating "bad actors."

Who Decides Which Job Gets Rewarded?

Initially in the base-setting of the protocol, we will write up some fundamental rules for job types that can be rewarded based on the platform we're building. We want to incentivize users to act within our network. You can think of these rules as the Causevest Commandments. However, we also provide an open-source platform that links directly to the protocol, so while we set the initial platform rules (Causevest Commandments), individual platforms can break down who receives rewards by allocating additional jobs and tasks that they believe will be useful, have a positive impact, and generate new XCV coins.

What we Want from You

There are a lot of good, hidden causes that slip through the gaps and are hard to find. Despite people doing good work, many causes aren't being funded or financed by anyone. The Causevest network capital (XCV) could go to these causes, benefitting their future work and allowing for expanded good efforts.

As an Operator, your first priority is to go out into the world, find these good, hidden causes and help them out.

You of course will get rewarded for this.

Operator Tasks

Additional Operator tasks include external network operations. The ability for Operators to go out of there way and do additional work is down to the individual, but it is an option.

Causevest will provide capital and additional training to encourage Operators to engage in external network operations.

These operations may include, but are not limited to, the following:



These operations may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Fundraising for individual causes
- Market making for causes and charities listed on the network
- Acting as a point of call and communication for causes and locations outside of the United Kingdom or the Western world
- Onboarding people onto the network
- Educating hidden causes
- Helping causes receive the capital and financing they should be receiving from the network
- Breaking down initial barriers to entry left by the traditional financial services sector
